


Excitement and spirit filled the air during Homecoming weekend festivities. It is one of our oldest traditions - when Clemson alumni and families return "home" from

From an early age, Harry's life was influenced by service. The son of a career Air Force officer, Harry was born at Donaldson Air Force Base in Greenville, South Carolina. Upon his father's retirement, Harry completed high school at T.L. Hanna High School in Anderson, South Carolina and endeavored to attend an out-of-state university. After his freshman year out of state, Harry returned home to work parttime and attend night school. He was drafted into the U.S. Army and completed Basic Training and Airborne School at Fort Benning in Georgia. Harry served a 12month tour in Vietnam with the 173rd Airborne Brigade from 1966-1967. He was called home after that tour to serve as an advanced infantry instructor at Fort McClellan, Alabama, preparing the brave young men for the difficult times they
